

74% of Georgia cities have a population of 5,000 or less.




Metropolitan statistical areas account for 91% of GDP in Georgia.




Cities provide 69% of jobs in Georgia.

RACIAL DISTRIBUTION OF POPULATION








# THE VALUE OF GEORGIA'S CITIES 2023

regions have implemented a Regional (TIA) TSPLOST (as of January 2023).




